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

### Key drivers for growth



#### **Global Air Traffic Demand**

- Last 40 years air travel has grown 600%.
- Just over 3 billion passengers carried in 2013. The average CAGR is 5%.
- The growth rate has increased since 2002 and varies across different markets.
- Boeing are forecasting the current number of planes in service (20,310) will be double by 2032.

#### Air Traffic in Turkey

- Turkey has also seen this growth. Since 2002:
- CAGR for international traffic to Turkey is more than 10 while CAGR for domestic is 22%.
- Istanbul has seen a significant portion of this growth increasing traffic 4.5 times since 2002 compared to 2.5 times for Antalya.





Figure 1: Global air traffic demand since 1973

### **Turkish Aviation Market**



- Turkish aviation market grew by 14% CAGR from 2002 to 2014.
- Growth rate was 12,1% for the last 24 months
- The total number of passenger in 2014 was 166 million.
- Frequency of Turkish Air Routes reveals the dependency on the European destinations and significant growth opportunities in Asia and the Middle East.
- Turkish carriers are able to shift their focus to the fastest-growing regions.





### Current situation in Istanbul



There are two airports serving the city of Istanbul; main gateway and Europe's 4<sup>th</sup> biggest airport after LHR, CDG and FRA; Istanbul Atatürk (IST) on the European side and Europe's fastest growing airport; Istanbul Sabiha Gökçen (SAW) on the Anatolian side.

- Atatürk Airport handled 57m/yr. pax in 2014 and reached its built capacity / 2 runways
- Sabiha Gökçen handled 24m/yr. pax in 2014 and reached its built capacity / 1 runway

Ataturk airport will close to commercial operations when INA opens
















